It was in Brno that Gregor Mendel discovered his laws of heredity, Viktor Kaplan produced the first water turbine, Leoš Janáček composed his musical works and where Milan Kundera wrote his first novels. Brno is the birthplace of Kurt Godel - one of the world's most important 20th century scientists.
